

STEPS INVOLVED IN BECOMING A VOLUNTEER FOR BAPTIST HOSPITAL

STEP ONE: Volunteer Application and Release Form

The Volunteer application and release form should be completed in its entirety and returned to Volunteer Services at the facility of interest.

STEP TWO: Background Check

For volunteers over the age of 19, a background check will be completed using a person's name and Social Security Number. Volunteers are asked to sign an authorization and release form to give Baptist permission to do this background check.

STEP THREE: Health Screening

You will be contacted by the Volunteer Office before you begin this step.

For volunteers under the age of 19, Baptist will need a copy of your immunization record showing: 2 MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella); either a physician document history of Chickenpox or 2 Varicella vaccinations; Either 3 series of Hepatitis B shots or a parent signed declination waiver. In addition, a 2 step TB test will be administered if you have never had one or it has been over a year (the hospital will administer at no fee to volunteer) or a single TB test will be given if you have a record of previous TB within a year.

For volunteers 19 or above, Baptist requires a 2 step TB test (the hospital will administer at no fee to volunteer) or a single TB test will be given if you have a record of previous TB within a year.

STEP FOUR: General Orientation/Department Orientation

General Orientation may be slightly different from facility to facility but the overall training you receive will prepare you for serving in a hospital setting. It is mandatory that every volunteer attend general orientation. Department Orientation will prepare you for how the department runs as well as focuses more on your service and training for you. You will receive your Hospital ID Badge at one of these orientations.
